EDUCATIONAL PERMIT

This permit authorizes Jill Parson, Alaska Wild Bird Rehabilitation Center, Inc.
(person, agency or organization)
of P. O. Box 521186, Big Lake, AK 99652 to conduct the following
(address)
activities from January 28, 2016 to January 31, 2017 in accordance with AS 16.05.930.

Authority is granted to the permittee and subpermittees authorized under the permittee's current federal permit to possess the following live, permanently disabled birds for educational purposes: three (3) great horned owls, and one (1) of each of the following species: great gray owl, Harlan's red-tailed hawk, northern saw-whet owl, red-tailed hawk, Sandhill crane, and short-eared owl. **Education birds may not be imported to or exported from the state, or permanently transferred to another institution within Alaska without prior written authorization from ADF&G.** New permanently crippled birds may not be added to the permittee's educational program from the permittee's rehabilitation program, from other institutions in Alaska, or imported without prior written approval from ADF&G. No birds held under this permit may be propagated.

The primary permittee may designate subpermittees to conduct activities authorized by this permit. The primary permittee is responsible for the actions of all subpermittees and for ensuring their compliance with the conditions of this permit. Persons conducting activities authorized by this permit are exempt from Fish & Game licensing requirements of AS 16.05.330.

An annual report must be submitted electronically on a form provided by the Department to the Permits Section (dfg.dwc.permits@alaska.gov) by the date specified below. The report must include the following for each education bird held at the facility at any time during the calendar year: name or ID, species, sex (if known), age (if known), date and source of original acquisition, street address where housed, and a summary of the educational programs in which the bird was used during the year. The report must also include the date, disposition, and cause of death (if applicable) for all education birds that die or leave the facility. Please attach copies of any necropsy reports.

THIS PERMIT AND CURRENT FEDERAL PERMIT(S) MUST BE IN POSSESSION WHILE CONDUCTING AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES.

REPORT DUE January 20, 2017. The report shall include the information specified above.

GENERAL CONDITIONS, EXCEPTIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

1. This permit must be carried by person(s) specified during approved activities who shall show it on request to persons authorized to enforce Alaska's fish and game laws. This permit is nontransferable and will be revoked or renewal denied by the Commissioner of Fish and Game if the permittee violates any of its conditions, exceptions or restrictions. No redelegation of authority may be allowed under this permit unless specifically noted.
2. No specimens taken under authority hereof may be sold or bartered. All specimens must be deposited in a public museum or a public scientific or educational institution unless otherwise stated herein. Subpermittees shall not retain possession of live animals or other specimens.
3. The permittee shall keep records of all activities conducted under authority of this permit, available for inspection at all reasonable hours upon request of any authorized state enforcement officer.
4. Permits will not be renewed until detailed reports, as specified above, have been received by the department.
5. UNLESS SPECIFICALLY STATED HEREIN, THIS PERMIT DOES NOT AUTHORIZE the exportation of specimens or the taking of specimens in areas otherwise closed to hunting and fishing; without appropriate licenses required by state regulations; during closed seasons; or in any manner, by any means, at any time not permitted by those regulations.
