Alaska WildBird has been busy with the rehabilitation of multiple Pine Grosbeaks who have been victims of window strikes. These are social birds, but when they sustain injuries unless they are protected during their recovery they are easy prey to larger birds, cats, or squirrels. Our success rate with the birds brought to our center to date has been 100%, thanks to our flight cage, where they have time to regain strength and become fully flighted before release. Mature males have bright red coloration. The photo is of an unusual russet colored bird that we have in our flight cage; a few females and first year males have this coloring. The typical female has some gold color.

Thank you to the alert public who have saved these birds.
